MARICOPA COUNTY ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS FOR MARCH 2005

(Phoenix)-- The Environmental Services Department initiated legal action against the following facilities/establishments or individuals in March 2005 for violations of the Environmental Health Code.

Tacos Jalisco 9802 N. 7 th Street Phoenix, AZ 85020	<p><u>Permit Revocation</u> - Permit revocation letter was issued due to serious and/or repetitive violations of the Maricopa County Environmental Health Code. Examples of violations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improper employee practices • Cross-contamination risk <p>Note: This establishment signed a stipulation agreement.</p>
BJ'S Chevron 5060 W. Bell Rd. Phoenix, AZ 85037	<p><u>Permit Revocation</u> - Permit revocation letter was issued due to serious and/or repetitive violations of the Maricopa County Environmental Health Code. Examples of violations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Inadequate storage of chemical products • Inadequate cleaning of food contact surfaces <p>Note: This establishment will try to qualify to sign a stipulation agreement.</p>
Carniceria Morelos 9415 N. Cave Creek Rd. Phoenix, AZ 85020	<p><u>Permit Revocations</u> – Two permit revocation letters were issued against a meat market and an eating and drinking operation due to serious and/or repetitive violations of the Maricopa County Environmental Health Code. Examples of violations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improper food temperatures • Insect problems (cockroaches)

<p>John Louis Dowden</p>	<p><u>Citation</u> - A Citation was issued for conducting a mobile pet shop operation without a permit from Maricopa County Environmental Services Department. A pretrial conference was scheduled for May 11, 2005.</p>
<p>Michelle Quiroz Garcia</p>	<p><u>Citation</u> - A Citation was issued for modifying a sewage discharge without the approval from Maricopa County Environmental Services Department. A pretrial conference was scheduled for April 28, 2005.</p>
<p>German Cruz Alvarez</p>	<p><u>Citations</u> - Two Citations were issued for operating a mobile food establishment without a permit from Maricopa County Environmental Services Department and for selling food from unapproved sources. Arraignment was scheduled for April 20, 2005.</p>
<p>Juan Jose Estrada Cordova</p>	<p><u>Citation</u> - A Citation was issued for operating a mobile food establishment without a permit from Maricopa County Environmental Services Department. Arraignment was scheduled for April 20, 2005.</p>

Candelerio Cano-Bruno	Citations - Two Citations were issued for operating a mobile food establishment without a permit from Maricopa County Environmental Services Department and for selling food from unapproved sources. Arraignment was scheduled for April 25, 2005.
Alejandra Raya Reyes	Citations - Two Citations were issued for operating a mobile food establishment without a permit from Maricopa County Environmental Services Department and for selling or giving away food from unapproved sources. Arraignment was scheduled for May 2, 2005.
Carol Blake	Citation - A Citation was issued for improper sewage and wastewater disposal. Arraignment was scheduled for April 12, 2005.
Kadhun Mumain Shabeel	Citation - A Citation was issued for operating a mobile food establishment without a permit from Maricopa County Environmental Services Department. Arraignment was scheduled for May 9, 2005.
Richard Louis Belanger 7747 W. Flower Street Phoenix, AZ 85033	Cease and Desist Order – A Cease and Desist Order was issued for operating a pet shop without qualifying for the required permit from Maricopa County Environmental Services Department.
Mi Restaurant 5850 N. 43 rd Avenue Glendale, AZ 85301	Cease and Desist Order – A Cease and Desist Order was issued for operating a food establishment without qualifying for the required permit from Maricopa County Environmental Services Department.

The Environmental Services Department uses one of the following methods of legal action to enforce the Environmental Health Code.

- **A Permit Revocation** may be initiated against a facility/establishment that has not demonstrated compliance or has been found in violation of any applicable code. Permit revocation may also be initiated against trailer parks, hotels, semi-public swimming pools, and retail food establishments.

- **A Permit Suspension** may occur immediately for serious environmental health code violations, which pose a major health hazard. The facility/establishment would not be permitted to operate.

- **Citations** are issued for violations of the health code. The citation directs the defendant to appear for arraignment in Justice Court.

- **Cease and Desist Orders** are issued for serious violations of the environmental health code. The violation must be corrected immediately and a hearing may be requested. Disregarding the order will result in injunctive action in Maricopa County Superior Court.
